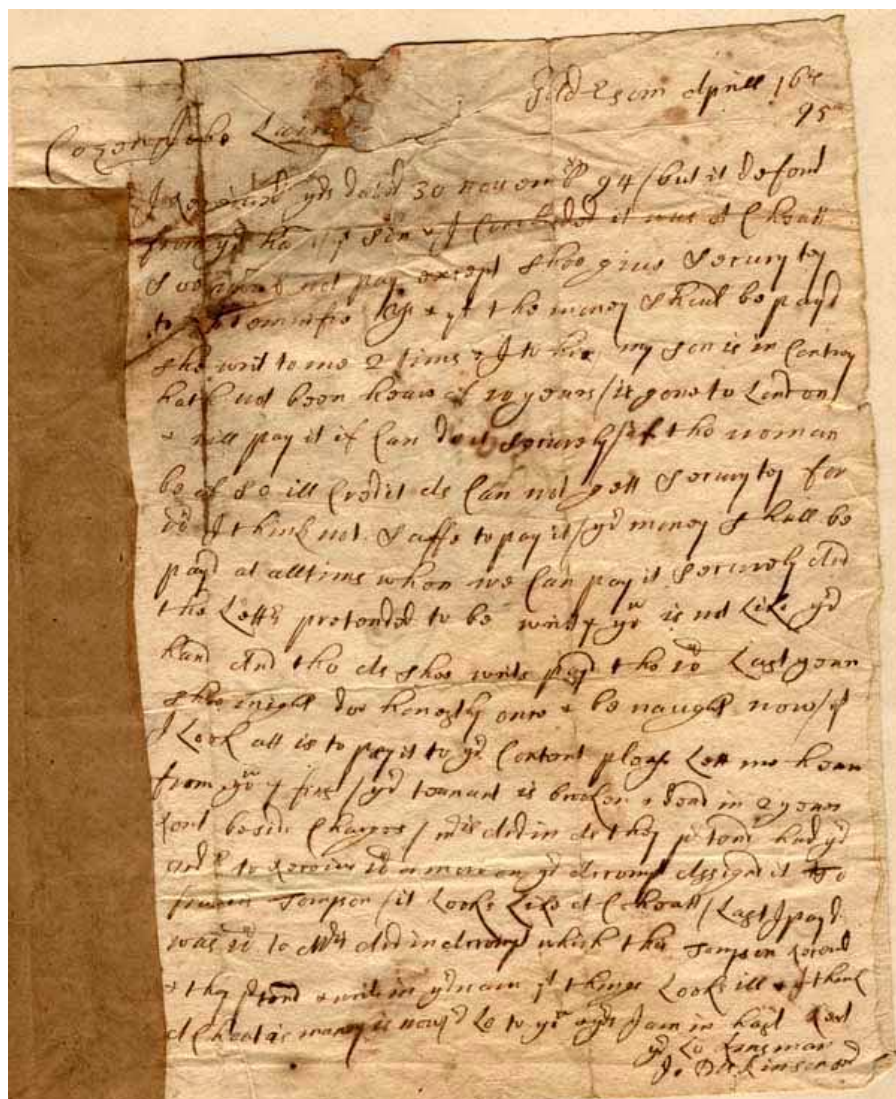

I received yo<sup>rs</sup> dated 30 novemb<sup>r</sup> 94/ but it ?deformd from yo<sup>r</sup> hand/ that son & I ?concluded it was a cheatt (*quite of bit of the following is smudged and torn*) soo would not pay except she gives security to ??emmifie use & yet the money should be payd she writ to me 2 times & I to hir/ my son is in contrey hath not been heare of 20 years/ is gone to London & will pay it if can do it securely/ if the woman be of so ill credit as can not gett security for 10<sup>W</sup> I think not saffe to pay it/ your money shall be pay<sup>d</sup> at all times when we can pay it securely and the letter pretended to be writ by you is not like your hand and tho as writs payd the 10<sup>W</sup> last year she might do honestly once & be naught now/ that I look at is to pay it to your content please lett me hear from you by first/ your tennatn is brooken & dead in 2 years rent besides charges/ Mrs Ardin as they pretend had your ?ard? to receive 10<sup>W</sup> or more on your accompt assigned it to Francis Tompson/ it looks like a cheatt/ Last I payd was 20<sup>W</sup> to Mrs Ardin Accompt which this Tompson received & they pretend & writ in your name that things looks ill & I think a cheat is money is now d Love to you and your I am in hast rest your loving kinsman
