June the 3rd 1695

Deare and Ever loving Sister and brother my kind Respects presented to you both hoping in god this may find you in good health Likewise my kind love to Coz Beard and his wife wishing them both health and happiness My great desire and hartely did long to have been with you before this time but I am wonderfully troubled that I am so frustrated in my designs and More because it was at your Request I have writ 2 letters before wherin I have informed Master Dickenson 2 Answers out of yorkshire which I hope you have Received but least they should miscary I have hear Inserted the Sum of his Answers first that hee darst not pay the Mony with out Security 2ly that It was not Job Lanes hand and 3ly that a tenant was gone away and had left 2 years Rent to pay and died and so it was left when the Gentlewoman your Neighbor came and brought mee a letter I sent it into yorkshire his son being there with mee and hee sent me word that if I could bring no Security I should have no money neither was I to be trusted with 20 pound in New England I brought 2 Gentleman which might have stood for mee but young Dickinson told them that was not Lane's hand to the bill and that hee supposed you had drawn a bill upon him without Lane's Order and intended to pay him when your money came over and Indeed dear Sister, I looked in my drawers and found Mr Lanes bill the last Coz Beard brought mee and indeed it differs verry much from any of thys for hee signed that bill but writ it not therefore dear Sister I desire you carefully to look onto it I am afraid you trusted some one that is a bad friend to you and mee but if it all holds in the same minde and that you make a Contract with some or Other of the merchants to take care to bring mee over I shall be contented still to come

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
