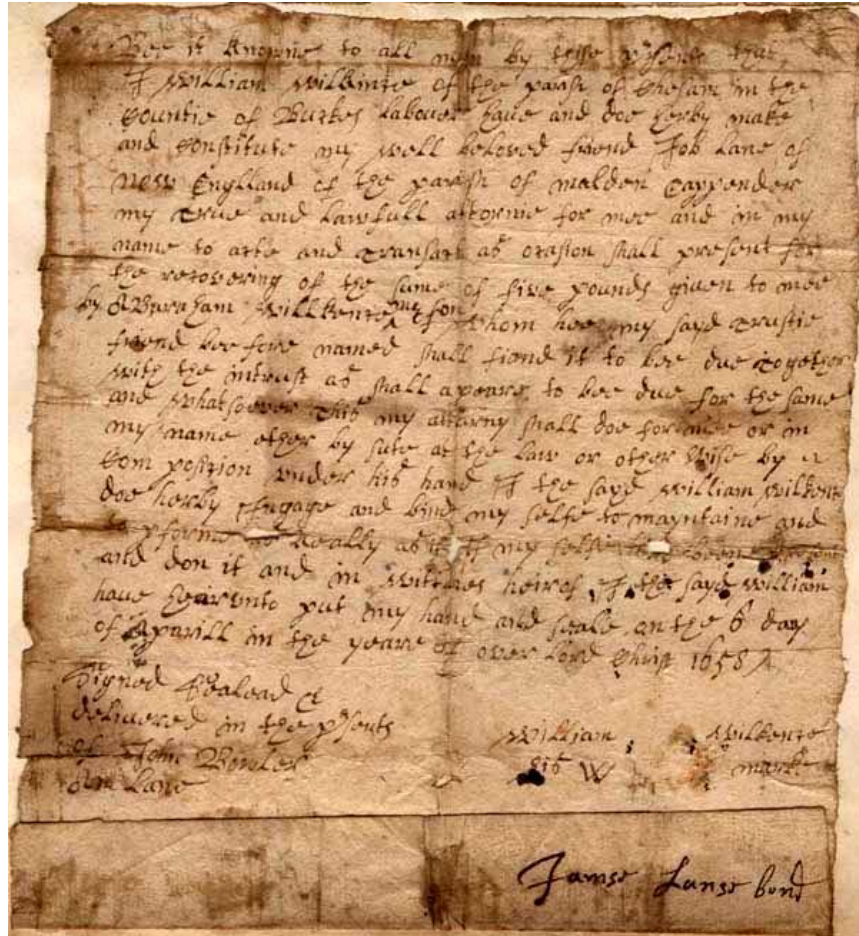


#42C April 6, 1658

Power of Attorney, William Wilkins to Job Lane



Bee it known to all men by these presents that I William Wilkinze of the parish of Chesam in the countie of Burks [Berkshire] labourer have and do hereby make and constitute my well beloved friend Job Lane of New England of the parish of Malden carpender my true and lawfull attornie for now and in my name to akte and transakte as occasion shall present for the recovering of the sume of five pounds given to me by Abaraham Willkenze my son whom hee my sayd trustid friend here fore named shall fiend if to be due together with the interest as shall appear to bee due for the same and whatsoever this my attorney shall doo for mee or my name other by sute at the law or other wise by composition under his hand of the sayd William Wilkin doo hereby engage and bind myself to mayntaine and to perform and do ably[?] as if that[?] my selfe had[?] been present and don if and in wittnes heirof I the sayd William have hear unto put my hand and seale on the 6 day of Aprill in the yeare of our Lord Christ 1658
