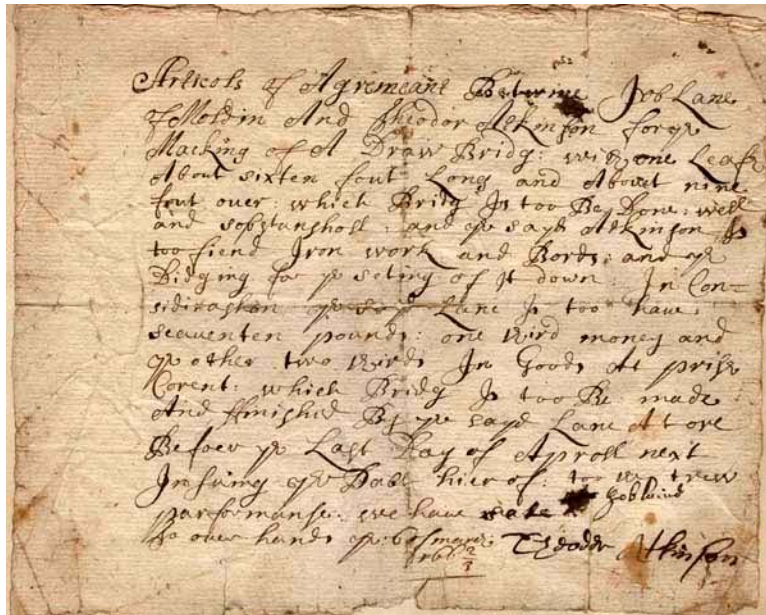


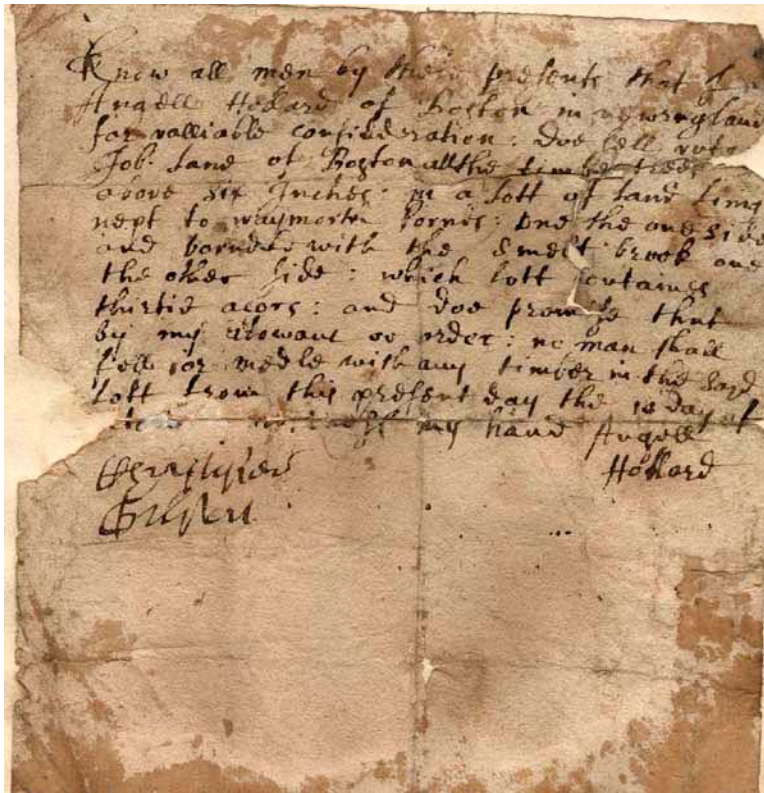
#43A March 6, 1662/3

Contract between Job Lane and Theodore Atkinson for construction of drawbridge



Articles of Agreement between Job Lane of Malden and Theodore Atkinson for ye making of a drawbridge with one lease About sixteen foute long and about nine foute over: which bridge is to be done: well and substantial, and the sayd Atkinson is to find iron work and bords; and the digging for the setting of it down: In consideration the sayd Lane is to have seventeen pounds: one third money and the other two third in goods at price current: Which bridge is to be made and furnished by the sd Lane at or before the last day of April next insuing the date here of: too witness performance we have sealed so our hands ye 6 of March 1662/3

Know all men by their present that I Angoll Hodard of Boston in new England for valuable consideration: doo sell unto Job Lane of Boston all the timber tree [ripped away] above six inches in a lott of land laying next to Waymouth ponde on the one side and bounded with the smolt brook on the other side: which lott contains thirteen acors: and doo promise that by my allowance so orderd: no man shall fell or medle with any timber in the sayd lott from this present day this [10?] day of [ripped away – possibly October] witness my hand Angell Hodard
