Indenture of John Queine of Ireland to Job Lane

This indenture witnesseth that John Queine of the county Cork in the Kingdom of Ireland of his own free will doth put himself to Job Lane of Malden in the colony of Massachusetts in new England carpenter to learn his art and with him his executes and assigns in the trade of carpenter and in such other country employment in reference to husbandry to serve from the day of the date here of unto the full end and term of seven years during his term the said apprentis his sd master his executes and assigns faithfully shall serve his and heirs [?servets] keep by lawfull command [?er?y] where gladly do He shall do no damage to his master nor see to be done of other but that he to his power shall let or forth with make known the same to his master. He shall not waste the goods of his master nor lend them unlawfull to any: He shall not play at any unlawfull games where by his master may have any loss: He shall not commit fornication nor contract matrimony within the said term: He shall not haunt Tavern Alehouse nor places of gaming nor absent himself from the service of his master day nor night unlawfully But in all things as a faithfull apprentize he shall behave himself toward his said master his executes and assigns by all his by these during the said term: And the said master his executes and assigns his said apprentize in the art and trade of a carpenter and in husbandry shall teach and instruct or cause to be instructed ffinding unto his said apprentize meat drink apparrell washing lodging and all other necessaries during the said term and at the end of the said term shall give unto his said apprentice two suits of apparrell. the one

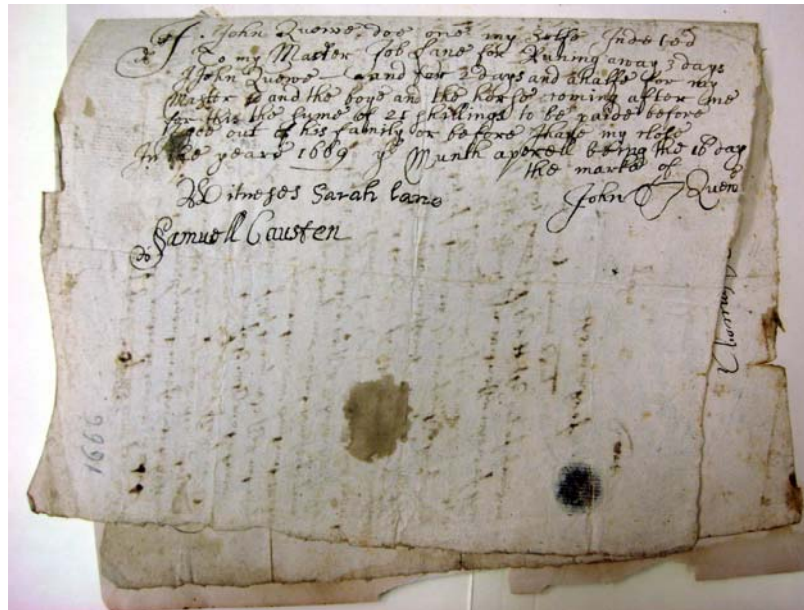

seales have set the fifth day of June in the year of our Lord one
thousand six hundred sixty and six
