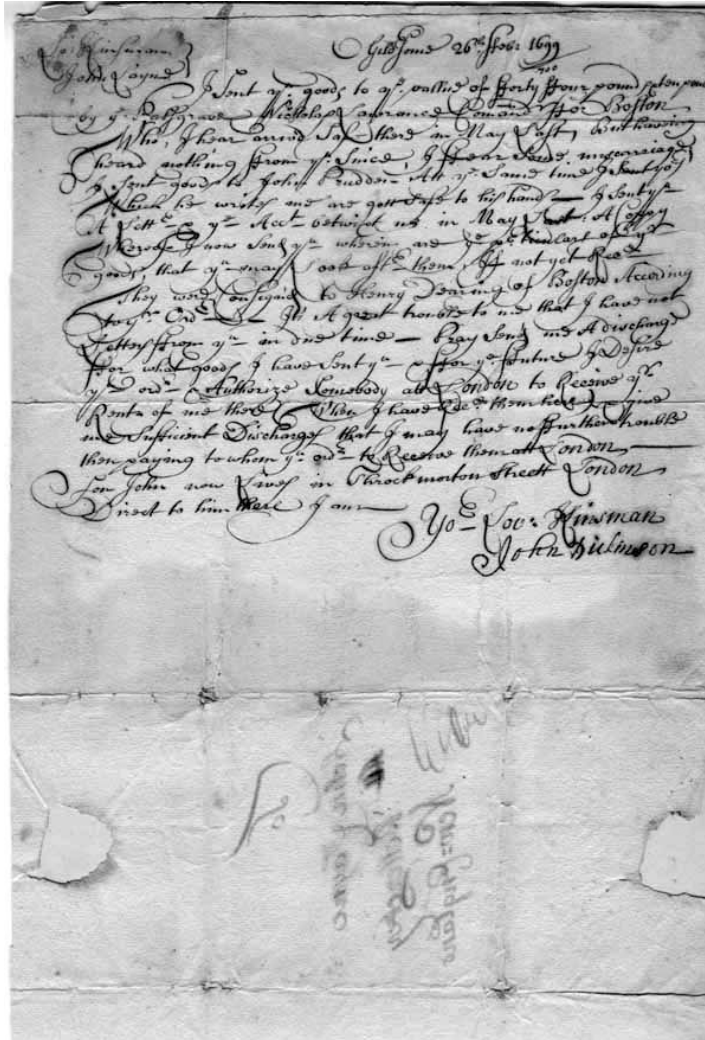


#58 February 26, 1699

Letter to John Lane from John Dickinson regarding unacknowledged shipment of goods



Gildsome 26th Feb: 1699

To: Kinsman John Layne

I sent you goods to the vallue of forty four pound per ton paid by the [ship] Palsgrave Nicholas Laurance Commander for Boston Who, I hear arrived safe there in May last, but having heard nothing from you since I fear some miscarriage; I sent goods to John Prudden att ye same time I sent yours which he writes me are gott safe to his hands--- I sent you a letter & ye acct betwixt us in May last: A cobby whereof I now send you wherein are the peticulars of your goods that you may look after them. If not yet received.

They were consigned to Henry Dearing of Boston according to your order ----- It's a great trouble to me that I have not letters from you in due time -- Pray send me a discharge for what goods I have sent you --- and for ye future I desire you order &--- Authorize somebody att London to receive your rents of me there. When I have rec'd them here and give me sufficient discharge that I may have no further trouble than paying to whom you order to receive them at London----

Son John now lives in Throckmorton Street London
Direct to him there I am
