The balance of that account due me was 3£ 0s 8d add what I have received now to your account & then the 11 May 98 the balance due to me was 6£ 4s to which add 3 years rent & you will find that 11 May last yr was 30 pd 16s 4d besides this last payment due me. I wonder the goods should lye so long in London & that no letters should come to your hand or if they did that you should send me no more & nothing of what I sent for suiting my [?
