June 25th 1700

Mr. Dickinson & Loving Kinsman
Sir

It being the desire of your honoured father that I would authorize somebody at London to receive my rents from him & to give him discharges of the moneys paid to my order by him. These are to request, order & impower yourself to receive of him whatsoever rents of my lands in England which may annually arise & from time to time come into his hands & to give him full discharge of the several payments by him made to you in my name the which I have now in a letter bearing date which with these presents, ordered him to doo & thus I doo authorize ty to doo in my name & stead as amply & fully as if I my self did it being personally present as wittness my hand this day & year above:

Furthermore these are to request & order you to lay out the moneys you shall receive of your Honoured Father on my acco'tt as from time to time you shall receive orders from me & in particular in Alamode 20 Ells searge 2 pieces [?Dowlace] two pieces stuffs of the newest fashion 3 pieces, if you please to send me this shall be your order: if there be more due then will purchase what I have specified, then please to send me the fill in the same goods according to the proportion which will abolge me much. I would request you would act as much for my profit as if you were acting for your self, both as to goodness & cheapness: what is reasonable satisfaction I hope you will know how to give yourself, only giving me acco'tt which with due

respect to your self & wife is all at present from your humble servent &

Your sons letters dated March 11 1698 with the goods then sent amounting with the charges, by invoice to 44£-0s-0p I received & Feb:23. 1699 by letters gave you discharge thereof: I know not well what to write then Rec: I had not received your letters, which in Aprill last I received bearing date May 11 1699 in which you give acco'tt of rents received & moneys payd for Kings taxes & to Mrs Ardell & other charges you have been at, some cash given to Jer[emiah] Boyes & the last goods you sent, all amounting to 63£-10s-00d all which I do aquitt & fully discharge you of. You make the Bal. to be 3£-0s-8d which if I rightly understood your acco'tt reacheth from the beginning of 91 to the middle of 97 with which I rest satisfied. I desire you would please to let me know how much per annum my rents are & who posses my lands & when the year begineth; being at some loss about it in my last letter. I sent for 20 ells of Alamode. 1 piece of searge, 2 pieces of Dowlace. I suppose by your acco'tt ther will be more due then so: I doo desire & order you to pay what moneys shall here forward be due to your son John in London whom I have Impowered for that end & to give you discharges from time to time according to your desire, that your trouble might be lessened; Sir if you think you need any further power than you have already to act for me with refference to my lands in England whatsoever you desire, signifie it to me & it shall be done to your minde I would be glad to know of the welfare of you & yours. My honored mother is yett living, my self, wife & those children I wrote to you of are in health. We have at present peace in our borders. I committ you & yours to the protection of God rendering you many thanks for your care & love hither so to me
