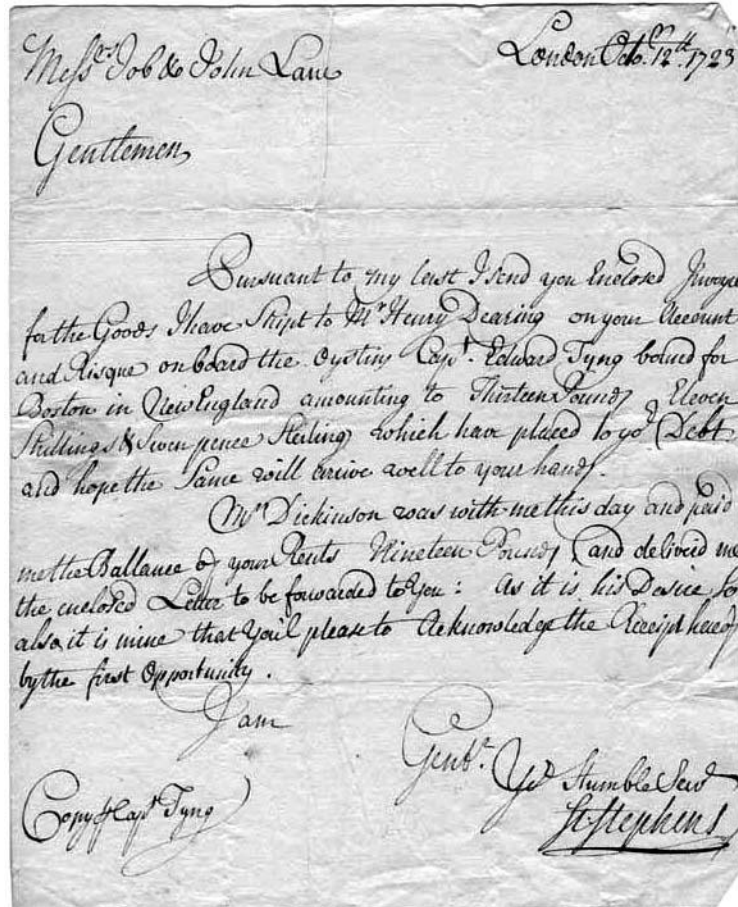

London Oct 12<sup>th</sup>

Gentlemen

Pursuant to my last I send you Enclosed Invoice for the Goods I have Shipt to Mr Henry Dearing on your account and Risque on board the Oystins Capt Edward Tyng bound for Boston in New England amounting to Thirteen Pounds Eleven Shilling & Seven pence Sterling which Have placed to yo<sup>r</sup> Debt and hope the same will arrive well to your hands.

Mr Dickinson was with me this day and paid me the Ballances of your Rents Nineteen Pounds and delivered me the enclosed Letter to be forwarded to you: As it is his Desire do also it is mine that you'l please to Acknowledge the Receipt hereof by the first Opportunity;
