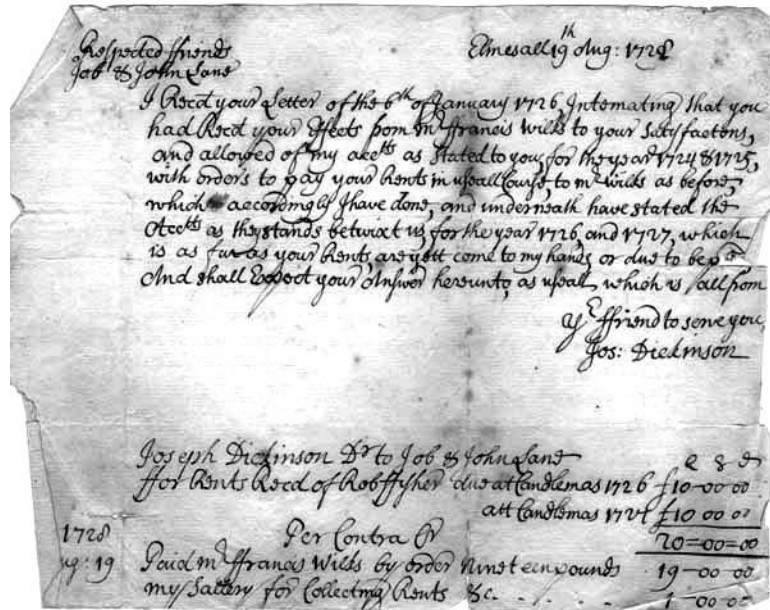

Statement from Joseph Dickinson

Elmesall 19th Aug: 1728

I Rec'd your Letter of the 6th of January 1726 Intimating that you had Rec'd your effects from Mr Francis Wilks to your satisfactions, and allowed of my accts as stated to you, for the years 1724 & 1725, with orders to pay your Rents in [?useall] course, to Mr Wilkes as before, which accordingly I have done, and underneath have stated the Acc^{ts} as they stands betwixt us, for the years 1726 and 1727, which is as far as your rents, are yett come to my hands, or due to be paid. And shall expect your Answer here unto, as usuall which is all from
