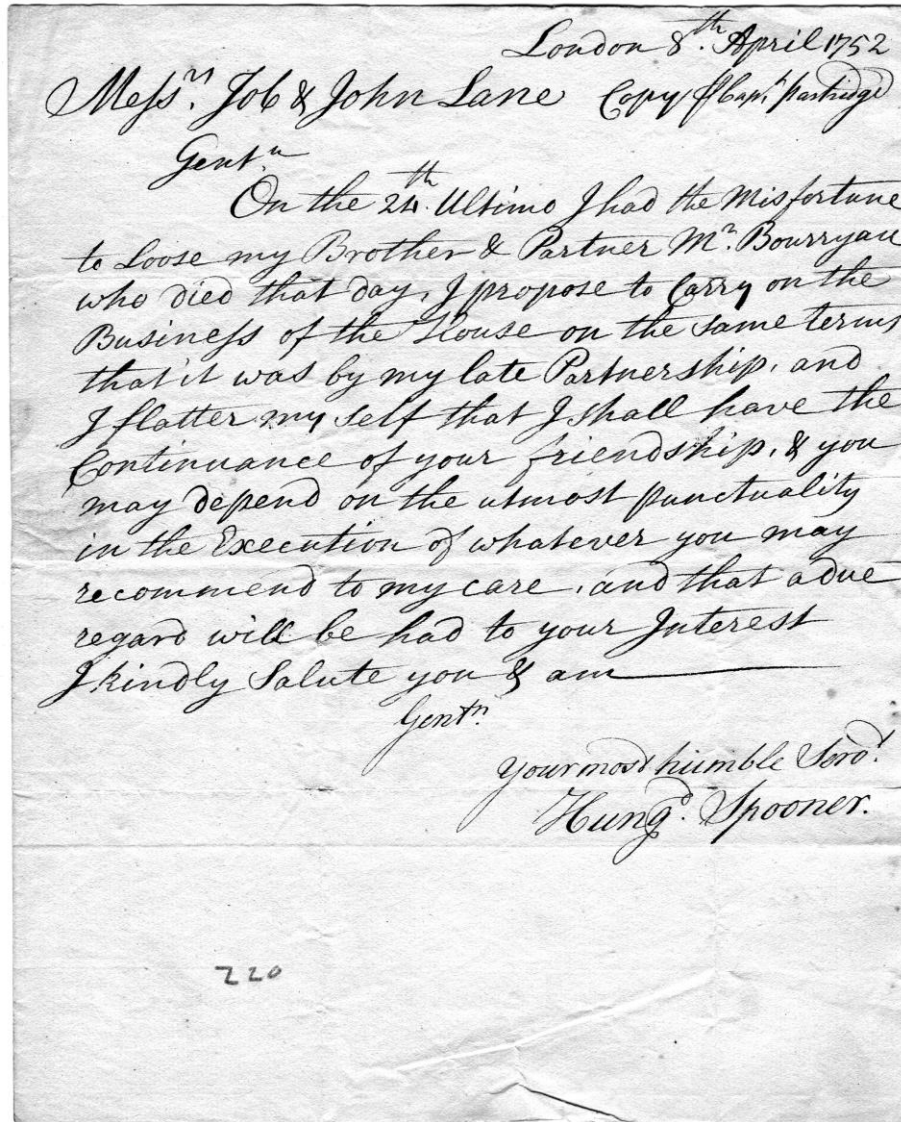

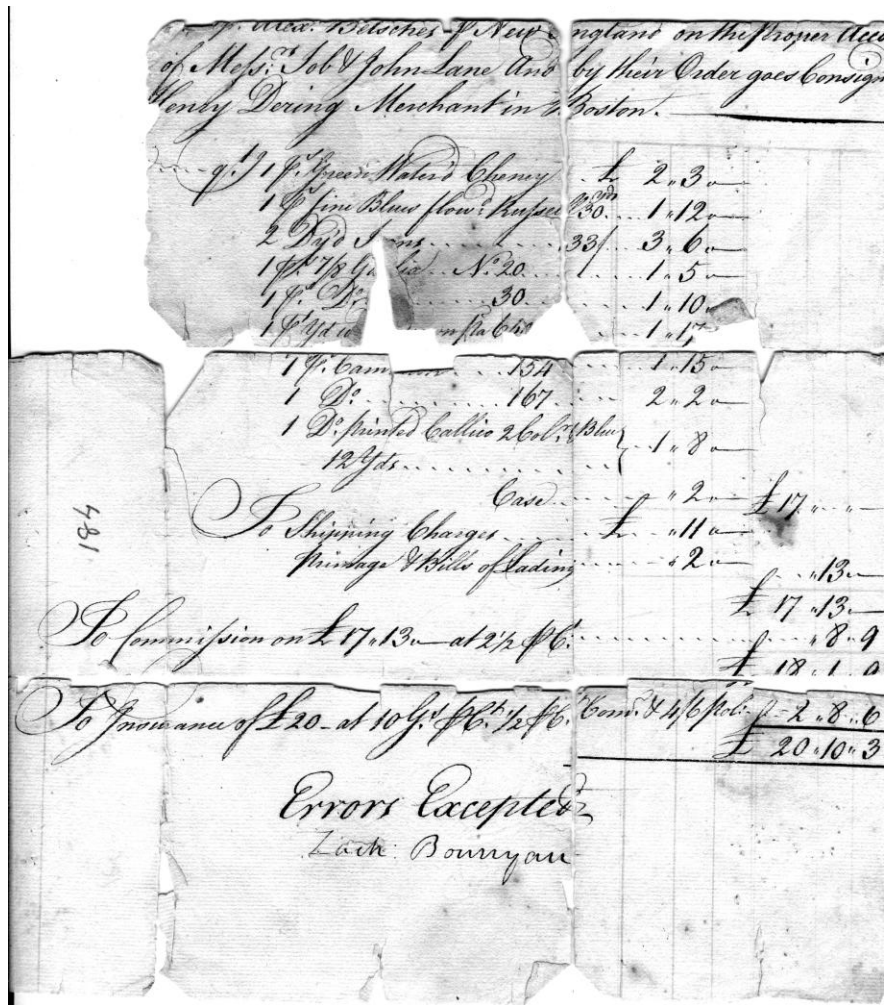

On the 24th Ultimo I had the misfortune to Loose my Brother & Partner M^r Bourryan who died that day, I propose to carry on the Businsee of the House on the same terms that it was by my late Partnership, and I flatter my self that I shall have the continuance of your friendship, & you may depend on the utmost punctuality in the Execution of whatever you may recommend to my care, and that a due regard will be had to your interest I kindly salute you & am----
