Letter from Joseph Dickinson to Lane Son & Fraser, forwarding power of attorney from American to permit building on English lands

Attorney from America which you will be so Obliged
to get rectified. I don't find that there is any thing wrong
except the Name which must be Altered to Joseph Dickinson
of Beverly Park in the East Riding of the County of York
Yeoman. Since I wrote last have heard from Charles
Fisher who hath proposed to build upon the Old Ruins at
Edston a pretty large Barn & Stables for six Horses and
_____ for 6 Cattle more at his own Expence and occupy
the Land upon the same Terms he now does. The House
he proposes to build upon his own Estate. Have wrote
him for Answer that I am agreeable to his proposal
and hope you will agree with me in thinking the Terms
fair on the Tenant's part and I trust favourable to the
Owners who will not be at any Expence herein.

Have wrote him for answer that I am agreeable to his proposal and hope you will agree with me in thinking the terms fair on the tenant's part and I trust favourable to the Owners who will not be at any expense herein.
