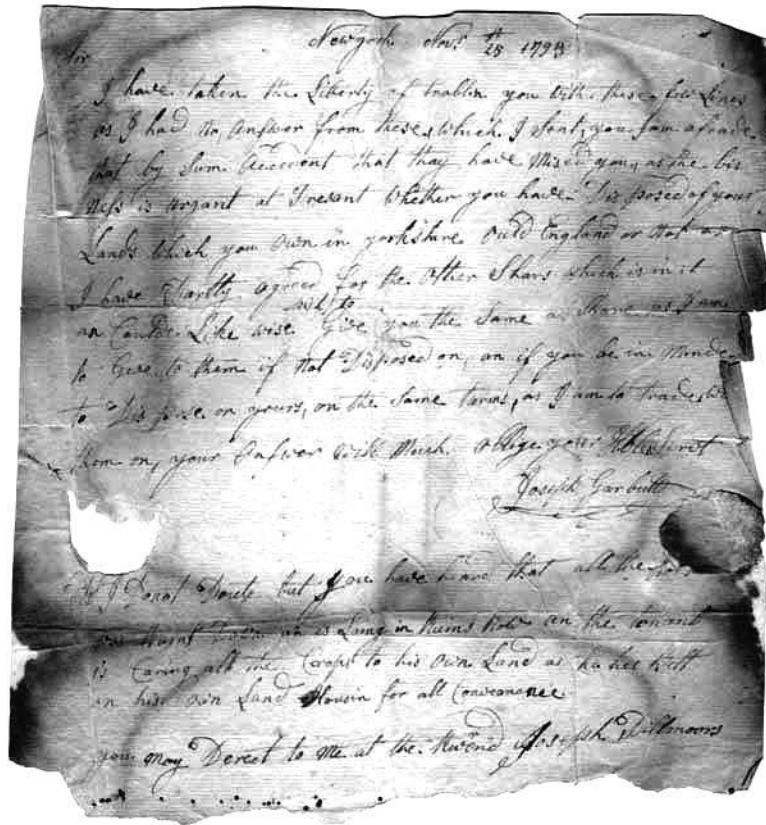


#164 November 13, 1795

Letter from Joseph Garbutt to Job Lane, inquiring if he has disposed of his land in England



New York Nov<sup>r</sup> 25 1795

Sir

I have taken the Liberty of troubling you with these few lines as I had no answer from these which I sent you I am afrade that by sum accident that they have missed you as the bisness is urgant at present [?] whether you have Disposed of your Lands which you own in Yorkshire Ould England or not as I have partly agreed for the other Shares which is in it an coulde Likewise <sup>wish to</sup> give you the Same as Share as I am to Give to them if not disposed on, an if you be in Minde to dispose on yours, on the same terms, as I am to trade with them on your answer Will Much oblige your Hmble servt
