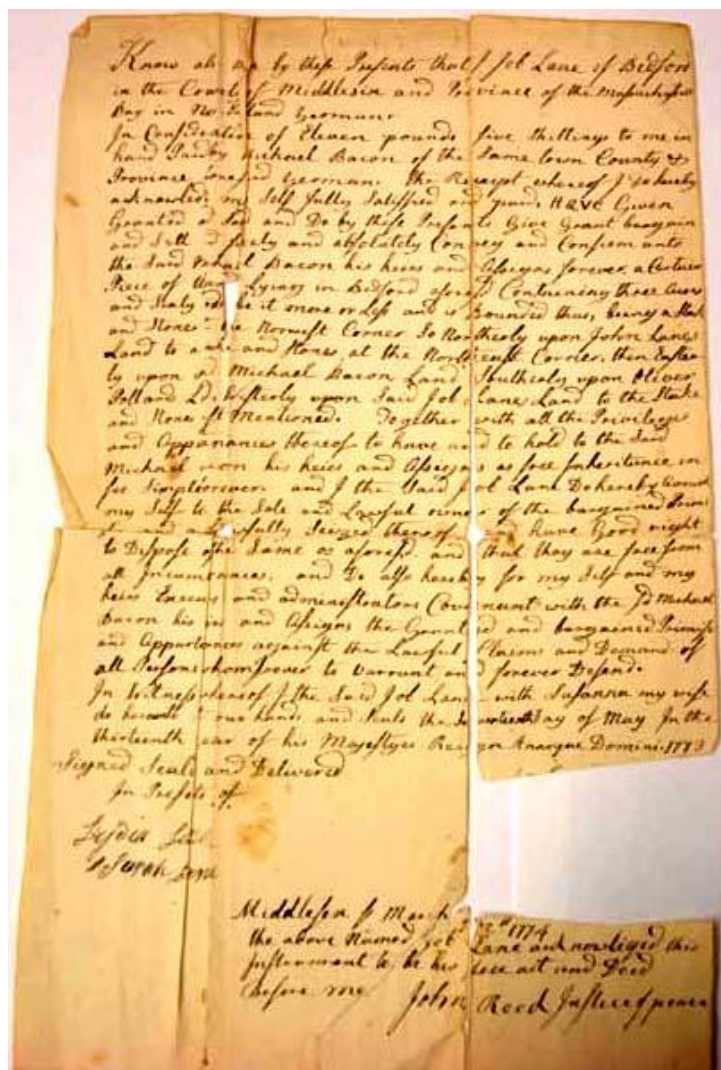

Job Lane 4's debt obligation to his father, Job Lane 3



Know all men by these presents that I Job Lane of Bedford in the County of Middlesex within His Majesties Province of the Massachusetts Bay in New England, Husbandman, am held and hand firmly bound and obliged unto my Honoured Father, Job Lane of the said Bedford, Gentleman, in the penal sum of One Hundred and Eighty pounds of lawful money of New England to be paid unto the said Job Lane, His Lawful Attorney, Heir, Executor Administrator or assigns: To the which Payment well _____mily to be made, I bind my self, Heir, Executor, and administrator firmly by these Presents sealed with my seal. Dated this Twenty Fourth day of March Anno Domini One Thousand Seven Hundred and Forty One-Two in the Fifteenth year of His Majesties Reign.

The Condition of this obligation is such that if the above bounder Job Lane (the Fourth), His Heir, Executor or Administrator shall w[e]ll and truly pay or cause to be paid unto His Father the abovenamed Job Lane His Lawful Attorney, Heir, Executor Administrator or assigns the full and just sum of twenty pounds in good bills of [credit] passable in said province or current lawful silver monsy of New England on or before the twenty fourth day of [?March] (*document is torn away here*) Year of our Lord one thousand and seven hundred and forty six-seven, without fraud, [?causing] any further delay: Then this obligation be void and of none effect: but [?due] to abide & [?remain] in full force power and virtue.
