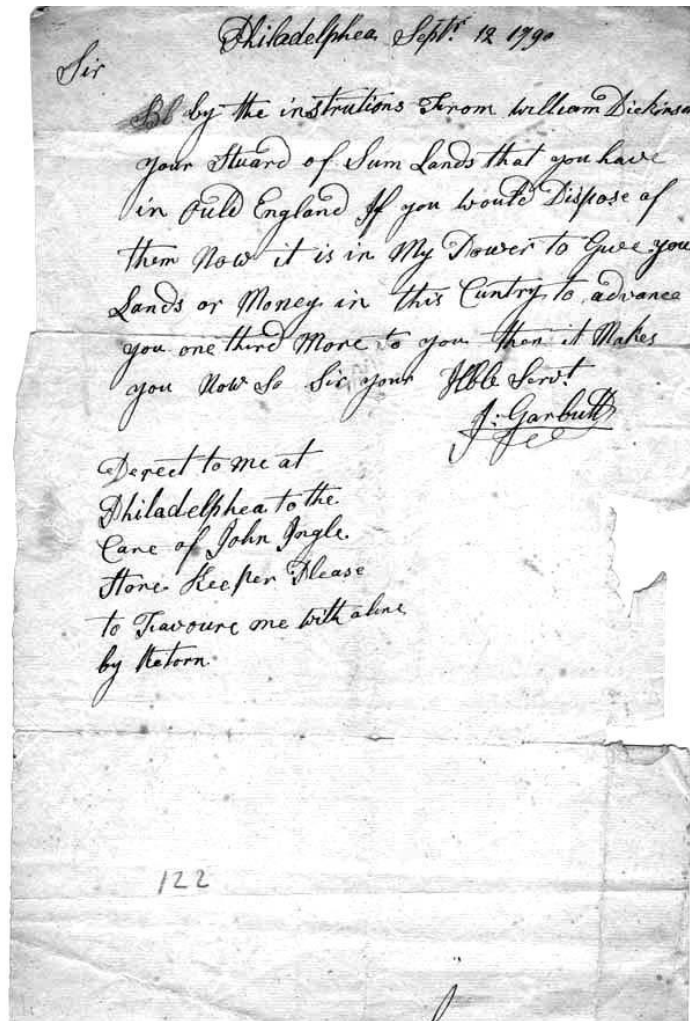


#182 September 12, 1790

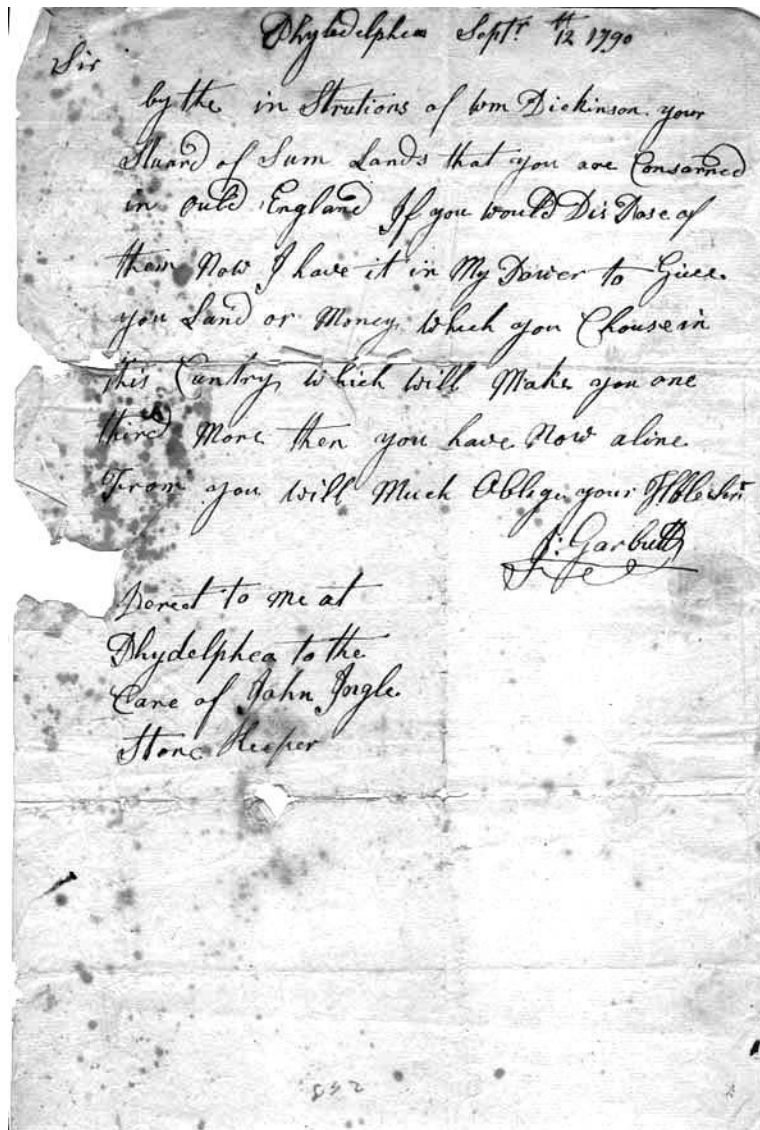
