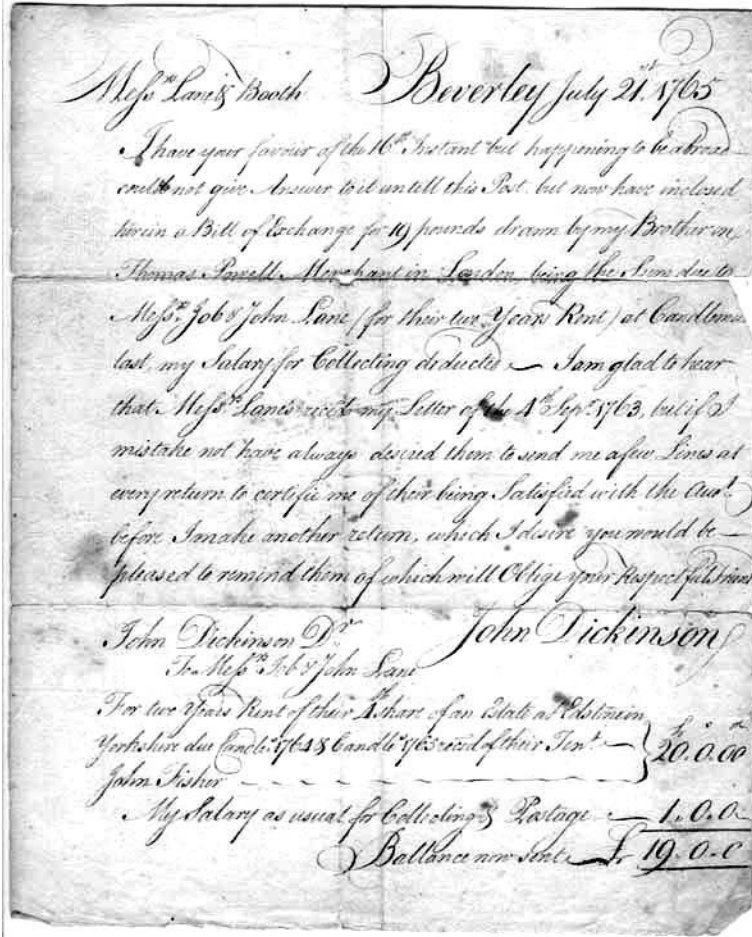


#185 July 21, 1765

Letter from John Dickinson to Lane & Booth

Beverly July 21 1765

I have your favour of the 16th Instant but happening to be abroad could not give Answer to it untill this Post. but now have enclosed herein a Bill of Exchange for 19 pounds drawn by my Brother on Thomas Powell Merchant in London being the Sum due to Mess^{rs} Job & John Lane for their two Years Rent at Candlemas last, my Salary for Collecting deducted. I am glad to hear that Mess^{rs} Lane's reced my Letter of the 4th Sep^r 1763, but if I mistake not have always desired them to send me a few Lines at every return to certifie me of their being. Satisfied with the acct before I make another return, which I desire you would be pleased to remind them of which will Oblige your Respectful Friend
