Letter from Lane &amp; Booth (2 c.) and letter enclosed

We duly receiv'd your favour of the 8<sup>th</sup> May  
In reply your friend M<sup>r</sup> Dickenson hath remitted

Season, when he comes to Town in the Winter we shall  
have an opportunity to discourse with him on the  
Exchange of your two little Estates viz<sup>t</sup> his Estate  
at your place for your's in Yorkshire, & we shall do it  
upon the strength of what M<sup>r</sup> Oliver hath writ  
him on the Subject & in due Course let you know

sent by Capt. Hunter consigned the said M<sup>r</sup> Oliver a case[?] of

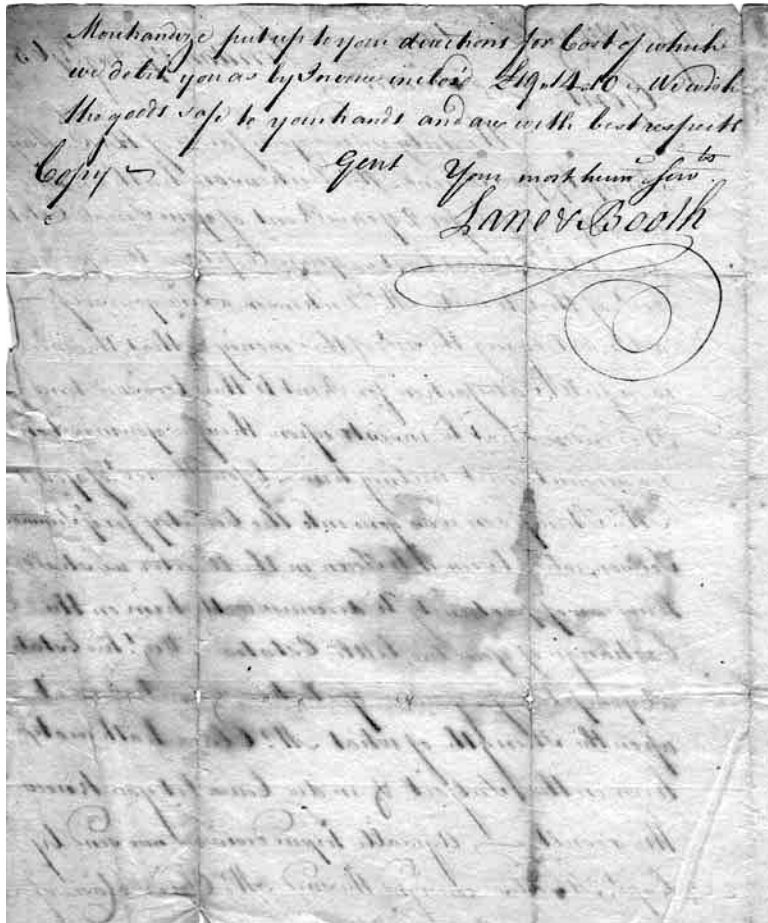
