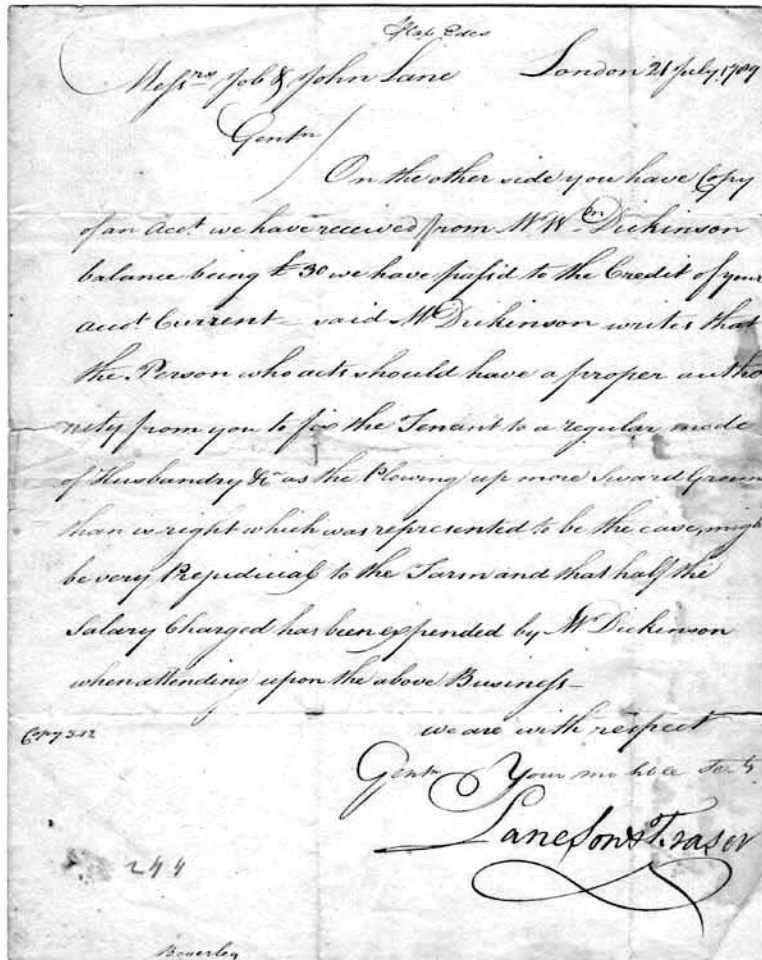

On the other side you have copy of an Acct. we have received from M<sup>r</sup> W<sup>m</sup> Dickinson balance being £30 we have pass'd to the Credit of your acct. Current said M<sup>r</sup> Dickinson writes that the person who acts should have a proper authority from you to fix the Tenant to a regular mode of Husbandry & as the Plowing up more sward ground than is right which was represented to be the case, might be very prejudicial to the farm and that half the salary charged has been expended by M<sup>r</sup> Dickinson when attending upon the above business.
