Letter from John Bullard, Pepperill to Job Lane

I take this opportunity to let you
 know that I am well at this time and left all
 well on the six day of this instant
 It was a very good time in getting up with
 our children and ~~the~~ goods thating Brock has
 Damage the children dont taulk any thing of
 coming back nor of seeing any body only their
 grandmother
 Remember me to all inquiring if you
 think that I have any
 your sister remembers her love to father
 and mother and brothers and sisters
 Sir but a little time nor paper
 so you must excuse ^{me} at this time
 in writing
 to Brother Lane
 Let if you will be so good as to send my
 watch by the bearer my brother John you
 will oblige your friend Sam^l Gilson
 Pepperill March 10 1788
